We came up with a few ideas; we launched the "Bethesda Bucks" gift card to encourage shopping and dining at our downtown Bethesda establishments, we posted Business Spotlight videos to our social media that highlighted our independently owned businesses, and we organized the inaugural "Savor Bethesda" Restaurant Week. Much like other Restaurant Weeks in the region, participating restaurants offered fixed menu meals at different price levels. Our 2021 "Savor Bethesda" Restaurant Week was a hit with both restaurants and customers, and we are excited to be bringing it back for its fifth consecutive year!

February 20 through Sunday
March 2, and participating
restaurants will offer \$10, \$20, and
\$35 fixed menus for lunch and
dinner, with carryout available at
some businesses. Savor Bethesda is

off some of their best menu items to new customers, and for residents to try new cuisines at a great deal.

This year, we have over 35 participating restaurants from Bethesda staples like Guardado's, Silver and The Salt Line a to newcomers like RUTA Ukrainian Restaurant and Baruch Café. Each year, theatre companies from around the region enter a frantic race to write, rehearse, and perform an original play in 24 hours. Why would they subject themselves to such a tight deadline, sleepless nights (for the writers) and 10 straight hours of rehearsals? Why, for the glory of being one of the featured companies in our annual event, Play in a Day on Saturday, March 8th at 8pm! (I'm sure the chance to win one of the three \$500 cash prizes doesn't hurt either!) The rules are simple: companies are given a prop, a theme, and a line of dialogue that must be repeated twice in the 10-12 minute play. Writers are given 12 hours to draft their scripts, and then the actors and directors have about 10 hours to rehearse it before performing in front of a live audience. It is a frantic, frenetic event filled with too much caffeine and lots of pizza, and the results of this rushed creativity are amazing!

This year we have six theatre companies participating, and here's your chance to get to know them before the event!

Adventure Theatre MTC is a musical theatre academy for youth in the Greater Washington, D.C. region that also has an integrated and nationally renowned professional theatre for family audiences.

The Keegan Theatre is Dupont Circle's resident theatre company, whose mission is to take audiences to the vital heart of the theater experience: extraordinary actors in an intimate setting exploring the human condition.

Flying V is a performing arts nonprofit based in Montgomery County that creates nerd and pop culture infused performances.

Imagination Stage is a full spectrum theatre arts organization, with classes and camps for children and theatre productions by professional artists and actors.

Rorschach Theatre tells stories that allow for innovative design and visceral performances. The company treats productions as "installations" that surround the audience with the world of a play.

Olney Theatre Center for the Arts produces and curates theatrical performance for the diverse audiences in our community, and educates, learns from, supports and inspires a more inclusive generation of theater-makers.
