Bethesda's Winter Wonderland Warms Up the Season on Dec. 7

Annual Event Features Holiday Market, Ice Sculpting, Santa Claus & More

November 25, 2024 (Bethesda, MD) – The Bethesda Urban Partnership kicks off the holiday season at Bethesda's Winter Wonderland on Saturday, December 7, 2024, from 12-4pm. A new holiday market featuring 50 artisans presented by URBNmarket will also be a part of this year's event. The celebration will feature choral performances, a live ice sculpting presentation, activities for kids, and a special appearance from Santa Claus starting at 2pm. Bethesda's Winter Wonderland is a free event held in Woodmont Triangle, located at the corner of Norfolk and Cordell Avenues.
